2.3 Analysis on Initial Assessment

The portfolio lies to the South West of \AA City Centre and falls within the West Midland Green Belt which extends south west from \AA urban area to Bromsgrove and Kidderminster. The land is situated within Bromsgrove District Council administrative area and includes a number of farm tenancies of which the Council own the freehold interest. The portfolio lies to the south and west of existing residential areas.

The portfolio is predominantly agricultural in nature, the land is severed by the M5 motorway that runs in a North South direction through the area. Land extending to the west is rural in character and has significant areas of woodland. To the east of the M5, motorway the land lies between the motorway and the western fringe of the \AA conurbation.

However, as this is a strategy report there is no requirement at the present moment in time to liaise with the wider community. However full consultation will take place as part of the project plan to implement the recommendations set out in the report.

3 Concluding Statement on Full Assessment

There has been ongoing consultation and engagement with the Local Planning Authority ie the Deputy Leader, Cabinet Member for Development, Transport and the Economy, together with The Executive Member for Longbridge and the Elected Ward Members have been consulted and support the report proceeding to an executive decision.
