- Use your bingo caller's card to call the bingo and keep track of which words have already been called.
- 2. Print off the bingo caller's card, cut each word out and put them in a bag (or similar).
- 3. To start the game, distribute a bingo card to each pupil.
- 4. Pull out a word from the bag and read it out loud (to make it more
